



- ★ Share a toy or treat.
- ★ Clean up after yourself without being asked.

- ★ Remember a lesson that your parents or teachers taught you and put it into practice at the next opportunity.
- ★ Do an act of kindness, without being asked, or asking to be recognized.
- ★ Don't lecture a friend, instead show them how to behave.
- ★ Treat peers fairly and do not gossip.
- ★ Can you think of other ways in which your actions show that you are a good citizen?

Actions speak louder than words. How we behave sends a powerful message about what we believe. Children often are instructed to do what they are told and not question it (the old, “do as I say, not as I do”), but every parent knows that children learn more from what they see their parents and other authorities do, than from the more abstract rules and lessons so often passed along to them.
